Children born to parents with a mental illness have been shown, over and over again, to be at an increased risk of developing mental health problems early in life. A recent comprehensive meta-analysis that gathered data from all over the world, including data from 3 million individuals at familial risk and 20 million control individuals, left no doubt

about the increased risk (1). On the other hand, not all children with a genetic predisposition for mental illness fall ill; in fact, many of these children stay well, at least in terms of not being diagnosed.

This double aspect-that on the one hand, offspring of parents with mental illness have an increased risk, and on the other hand, many stay well-is well-documented by Zhou et al. (2) in this issue of the Journal based on strong data from Swedish registers. The authors' aim was to supplement our knowledge and understanding of intergenerational transmission, not only by studying associations of parental diagnoses with rates of diagnoses and mental health issues among the offspring but also by including other behavioral outcomes, such as criminality, suicide, and aspects of psychosocial functioning, namely, school and labor performance. Six groups of parental diagnoses were defined as avnocurae (echizophrania binolar dicardar alcahol related much, at least when we look at the overall picture. Previous research has shown that offspring of parents with any psychiatric diagnosis are at increased risk of being ill themselves (3). In the study by Zhou et al., all risk estimates were increased in all six exposure groups, and there was no evident pattern of lower levels of risk with some parental diagnoses relative to others. The only exceptions to equally increased risks across the six diagnoses were that risks for bipolar disorder and schizophrenia were highest among children of parents with bipolar disorder or schizophrenia. When meeting patients with a psychiatric diagnosis who have children, the general transdiagnostic transmission of risk is important to keep in mind, so we can provide suggestions for preventive strategies and early intervention approaches that could have an impact on the children.

Although not all children with a parent who needs and seeks treatment for psychiatric symptoms become ill, growing up in such a family almost always has an impact on family life and the family
