Objectives	1. Describe the pathophysiology of common infectious, cardiovascular, neurologic, traumatic, and toxicological emergencies and use this information in the development of a therapeutic plan for an acutely ill patient. (Medical Knowledge)
	2. Obtain a proper problem-focused history and physical examination from a patient presenting to the emergency department (ED) with an unspecified chief complaint. (Patient Care)
	3. Formulate a differential diagnosis for their patient's chief complaint, prioritizing the likelihood of the diagnosis and considering worst-case diagnoses. (Patient Care)

	2. Medical students observe the process of evaluating and treating patients in close conjunction with Emergency Medicine (EM) PGYs, residents and attending physicians.
	3. Participate in weekly trauma pitfall meetings (Monday).
	4. Participate in weekly EM pitfall meetings (Tuesday).
	5. Participate in core teaching rounds (<u>5 per week</u>).
