FAPA Action Framework for Identified Priority Areas

2024-2034







In 2023, FAPA developed the 1st Asian Pharmaceutical Landscape Report and presented it during the FAPA 2023 Precongress Workshop held on October 2023. Through stakeholder consultation, recomendations for technical agenda in various domains were listed. The FAPA Asian Pharmacy Roadmap Technical Working Group synthesized the recommendations into 3 Priority Areas for the pharmacy profession in Asia.

For each priority area, progressive target outcomes are proposed with corresponding approaches that may be applied to action plans. The three (3) priority areas are: 1. Patient Safety, 2. Pharmaceutical Systems Strengthening towards Universal Health Care, and 3. Health Promotion and Wellness.




